059/20	<p><u>GREENING WYUMONDHAM</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • KETTS PARK - NORWICH FRINGE PROJECT Cllr. Hurn introduced his paper which outlined the present position that volunteer group Greening Wymondham are undertaking work on the woodland area under the supervision of the Norwich Fringe Project who have received a grant from the last 3 years. After discussion where it was agreed that Greening Wymondham had carried out valuable work and that the ultimate aim was to have trained volunteers. It was then further discussed that it would be appropriate to hold a meeting between all interested parties to review the situation for the future. • MOOT HILL • Cllr. Hurn referred to his paper outlining that Norfolk Archaeological Trust are looking to acquire Moot Hill and that Greening Wymondham are looking to maintain the site and will be applying for lottery funding. Greening Wymondham are looking for funding for future maintenance work in 4 to 5 years' time. <p>Upon the proposition of Cllr. Hurn and seconded by Cllr. Batchelor it was resolved to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Agree the funding for Norwich Fringe Project in the sum of £5,250 for the 2020/2021 season. 2. Under the current administration the Town Council will support the acquisition of Moot Hill by Norfolk Archaeological Trust; however the Council cannot commit funding to a project beyond the current council administration. 3. The Town Council will work together with interested parties to develop a management strategy for the woodland area at Ketts Park.
060/20	<p><u>REPORTS FROM COUNTY / DISTRICT COUNCILLORS</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Norfolk County Council - None • South Norfolk Council Cllr Halls reported to council that he had e mailed the Planning Department at South Norfolk seeking clarification on the new Planning white paper and its implications for development in the Town. Obviously, developers will want all land to be designated as Growth so get their planning permission automatically and it is unclear as who will decide which land falls into the relevant categories Growth, Renewal or protected. <p>There is a clear bias in favour of the developers in both Growth and renewal areas.</p>

	<p>Whilst noting the trigger point for affordable homes provision being now 50 ,and the District council's opposition to this , the dumbing down of Environmental assessments plus this change seems to confirm that this is a developers charter being imposed on District councils by Central Govt .</p> <p>Planning have replied but have no further details at this time but have agreed to let us know when they have them</p>
