DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST AT MEETINGS

Members are also requested when appropriate to make any declarations under the Code of Practice on Planning and Judicial matters.


If yes, you need to inform the meeting. When it is discussed, you will have the right to make representations to the meeting as a member of the public, but must then withdraw from the meeting.
