



The flowchart below gives a simple guide to declaring an interest under the code.

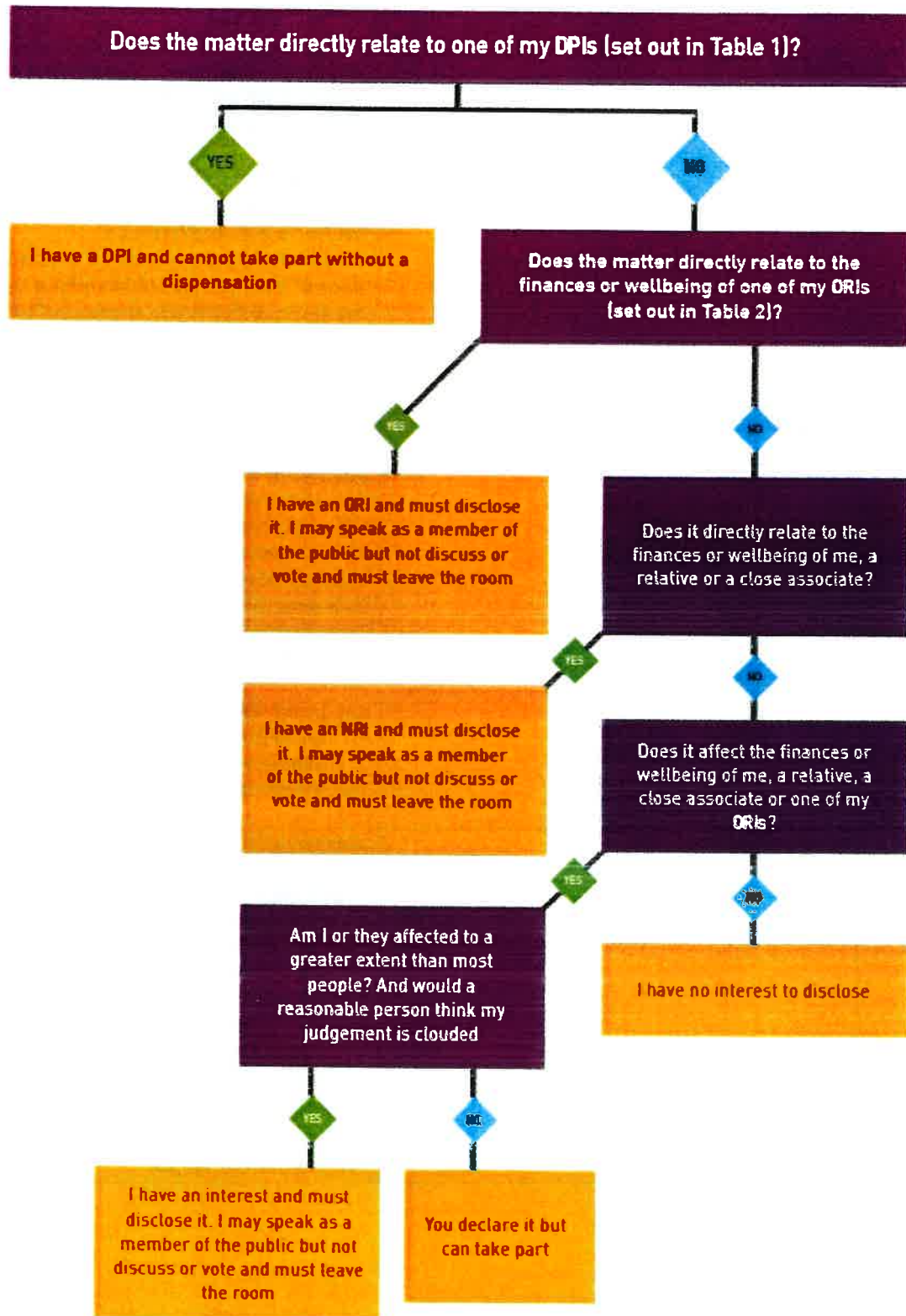


Table 1: Disclosable Pecuniary Interests

This table sets out the explanation of Disclosable Pecuniary Interests as set out in the [Relevant Authorities \(Disclosable Pecuniary Interests\) Regulations 2012](#).

Subject	Description
Employment, office, trade, profession or vocation	Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain.
Sponsorship	Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from the council) made to the councillor during the previous 12-month period for expenses incurred by him/her in carrying out his/her duties as a councillor, or towards his/her election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.
Contracts	Any contract made between the councillor or his/her spouse or civil partner or the person with whom the councillor is living as if they were spouses/civil partners (or a firm in which such person is a partner, or an incorporated body of which such person is a director* or a body that such person has a beneficial interest in the securities of*) and the council — (a) under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and (b) which has not been fully discharged
Land and Property	Any beneficial interest in land which is within the area of the council. ‘Land’ excludes an easement, servitude, interest or right in or over land which does not give the councillor or his/her spouse or civil partner or the person with whom the councillor is living as if they were spouses/ civil partners (alone or jointly with another) a right to occupy or to receive income.
Licenses	Any licence (alone or jointly with others) to occupy land in the area of the council for a month or longer

Corporate tenancies	Any tenancy where (to the councillor's knowledge)— (a) the landlord is the council; and (b) the tenant is a body that the councillor, or his/her spouse or civil partner or the person with whom the councillor is living as if they were spouses/ civil partners is a partner of or a director* of or has a beneficial interest in the securities* of.
Securities	Any beneficial interest in securities* of a body where— (a) that body (to the councillor's knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of the council; and (b) either— (i) the total nominal value of the securities* exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body; or (ii) If the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which the councillor, or his/ her spouse or civil partner or the person with whom the councillor is living as if they were spouses/civil partners have a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

* 'director' includes a member of the committee of management of an industrial and provident society.

* 'securities' means shares, debentures, debenture stock, loan stock, bonds, units of a collective investment scheme within the meaning of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000 and other securities of any description, other than money deposited with a building society.

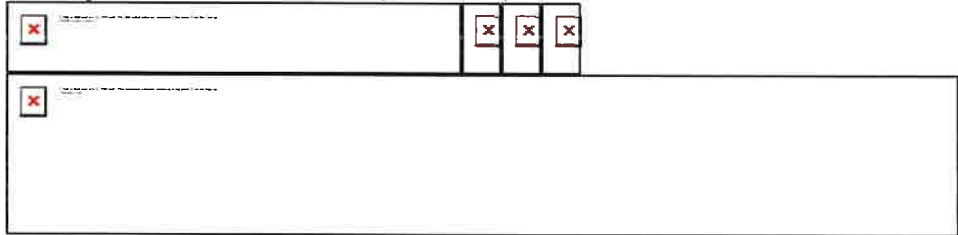
On February 15 2024, Norfolk County Council launched a public consultation on a saving proposal to reduce some street lighting in areas across Norfolk. The street lighting proposal forms part of a package of savings that have been put forward for consultation which is due to run until 22 March 2024. As part of our commitment to effective decision-making, we are seeking feedback from identified key stakeholders, including directly affected parish councils, county council members, and emergency services.

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Stakeholder briefing: Norfolk County Council's proposal to reduce street lighting

Re. Consultation: Your views on reducing street lighting in Norfolk

Norfolk County Council has launched a public consultation on a savings proposal to reduce some street lighting across Norfolk.

The consultation opened on 15 February 2024 and closes at midnight on 22 March 2024 and [available on our Citizen Space platform](#). There is also an Easy Read and paper copy available for download via the link above if you would prefer to respond by post.

Why are we proposing this?

Each year, Norfolk County Council reviews its budget and proposes the savings it will need to make for the following year to balance its budget. For 2024/25 the Council has proposed £41.5m of new savings, and we are seeking views on some of these proposals.

In common with almost all other upper tier authorities, we face very significant financial pressures arising from rising costs driven by inflation, growth in demand and under-funding. We are doing our best to protect key services, but we must take difficult decisions to agree a robust and sustainable budget for the year ahead.

Summary of proposed changes

We are proposing to reduce some street lighting in Norfolk which would affect approximately 1,000 lights. Doing this could save the council approximately £200,000 per annum (based on current prices).

Our proposals focus on areas where there will be minimal impact to drivers, pedestrians and cyclists. Locations which are known to be more heavily used by pedestrians are unlikely to be affected.

We are predominantly focused on switching off lights in the following circumstances:

- Isolated pockets of lights away from densely populated urban areas (such as residential areas), and where there is a limited benefit to those lights remaining on
- Areas where lights have been installed in the past but the reason for their installation is no longer applicable. For instance, where a concern with road safety is no longer evident due to changes to traffic flows or other highway improvements.
- Reducing the spread of lighting on the approach to more urban areas, such as between the city/town and its suburbs, and the countryside.
