Why is the Council looking to establish a new Cemetery when and why are residents paying for something | B) The existing Cemetery does not make a profit. A new Cemetery is being established as the existing Cemetery which opened in 1882 is nearly full and the Council |

| Q) For people to be more informed of what going on should a rolling electronic screen be installed in the Marketplace. | A) The Market Place is in a Conservation Area however Norfolk County Council are looking to install a Gold Standard Bus shelter which will incorporate an information screen. Update information panels are being prepared for installation in the Tourist Information |
| Q) Do the Councils speed Awareness Machines (SAM2) capture data | A) The Council has 3 mobile machines that move around. None capture data. |
| Q) Is the Council still committed to undertaking work at Becketswell. | A) Yes, we have tried to engage Norfolk Wildlife Trust to undertake an ecological survey following advice from South Norfolk Council. |
| Q) Is the Council planning anything to celebrate the 475 th anniversary of Robert Kett. | A) Yes. It is intended that there will be a community picnic at Ketts Park incorporating various enactments. |
| Q) Attended the inaugural meeting of the Public Realm Project Working Group. Public consultation will be undertaken. Ideas muted include a Banking Hub and crossing at Norwich Common. | A) Noted. |
